

The VA clinic, located in The Villages, Florida, is a 92,500-square-foot, single-story structure that will feature 500 examination rooms and offices, a laboratory, dental offices, mental health facilities, MRI and CT scan centers, administrative offices, an eye clinic, orthopedic clinic, radiology services, a pharmacy and related facilities.

Hamstra Group Building Florida VA Clinic

One of The Hamstra Group's construction sites is a very busy place this summer. The finishing touches are being performed on a brand new Veterans Administration Outpatient Clinic so this larger, more modern facility can open this year.

The clinic, located in The Villages, Florida (approximately midway between Ocala and Orlando), is a 92,500-square-foot, single-story building designed by KP Studio Architect (www.kpstudiarchitect.com). The Hamstra Group is in charge of construction, with Eric Carlson serving as the firm's project manager.

The structural steel complex will have masonry walls, stucco elements, and a design and color palette that complement the surrounding architecture. Beige, with accents of red brick and blue, the building will also be

expertly landscaped before opening.

The project, on which construction began in January 2009, will provide a brand new Veterans Administration facility to serve the growing veterans retirement community located in and around The Villages. Located at 8900 S.E. 165th Mulberry Lane, it will replace a smaller outpatient clinic at 1950 Laurel Manor Drive.

With more than 500 examination rooms and offices, the clinic will also feature a laboratory, dental offices,

mental health facilities, MRI and CT scan centers, administrative offices,

an eye clinic, orthopedic clinic, radiology services, a pharmacy and related facilities. A spacious and welcoming waiting area is also part of the design.

company has built a three-story, 125,000-square-foot office building in Phoenix, Arizona, for the VA, as well as outpatient clinics in Redding, California; Fort Worth, Texas; Crown Point, Indiana; and Appleton, Wisconsin. The Arizona project, which involved construction of a new regional office with administration facilities and benefits center, is one of the most attractive buildings in downtown Phoenix. Hamstra is also currently building two VA clinics in Las Vegas, Nevada (see story above).
