Industrial Chic And New Amenities Make Hamstra’s SP19 A State-Of-The-Art Restaurant

The golf course, restaurant and outdoor pavilion at Sandy Pines in Wheatfield is one of the most popular attractions in the northwest Indiana region. With a luxuriously landscaped course, fine dining and photo-perfect outdoor event facilities, Sandy Pines is host to a multitude of golf tournaments, weddings, banquets, private parties, and more.

But it was, according to owner The Hamstra Group, time for an upgrade of the proverbial “nineteenth hole”—the restaurant and bar responsible for food and libations at Sandy Pines.

And wow...what a change! Hamstra staff and well-known restaurateur Carl Bruggemeier worked together on an “industrial chic” redesign that has customers in awe. The “steam punk” beer tower has become the talk of the town (and beyond).

Aside from a revamp of the look and ambience of the restaurant, the new SP19 needed kitchen updates, as well. Since the kitchen serves both the restaurant and The Pavilion outdoor events, more space was needed. The upgraded facility now boasts a separate kitchen for parties and events, with serving windows that provide access to the outside for faster service.

Now, both The Pavilion kitchen and restaurant kitchen are state-of-the-art facilities with more room, more storage areas, a new soda system, a professional dish washing system, and other amenities.

SP19 seats 119 guests and has a special private dining room after the renovation. The front outdoor patio accommodates 40. Of course, the event space—The Pavilion—is larger and seats a maximum of 264 people at tables. Work on the massive renovation project began on February 16 and the doors opened to the public on May 5.

It wasn’t just the physical space and decor that enjoyed upgrades. The menu now has many new dinner entrees featuring farm fresh produce and gourmet touches.
